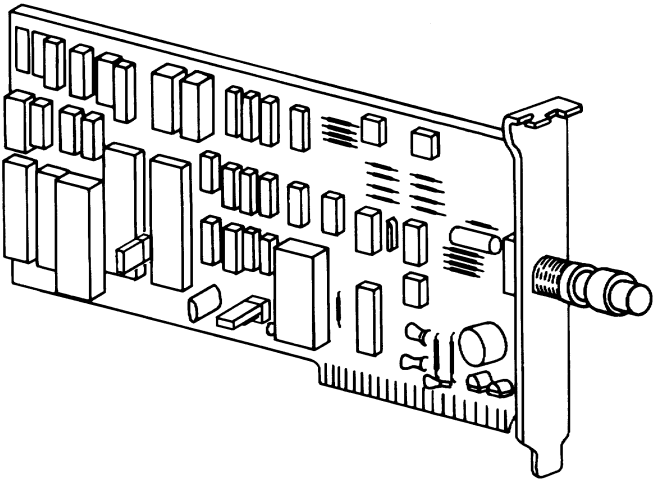

- To ensure proper operation of the Cluster, the shielding of the coaxial cable cannot be grounded at more than one point.
- If compliance to electrical codes require multiple ground points, then triaxial cable (double shielded) must be used. In using the triaxial cable, only the outer shielding can be grounded and under no circumstances should the outer shield be connected to the inner shield.
- This installation should be performed by a licensed electrician.

- The IBM Personal Computer Cluster Adapter is designed to interconnect up to 64 IBM Personal Computers using RG 59U coaxial cable.
- An Installation Manager is needed to plan, install, and maintain the Cluster (A Cluster is all of the Personal Computers, Cluster Adapters, and coaxial wiring). As the Cluster is being installed, it is necessary for the installation manager to develop a Cluster Map. The Cluster Map can be a diagram or listing of the Personal Computer location, the adapter number assigned, the station (a station is a Personal Computer on the Cluster) address, and the order in which the stations are connected.

Note: If you have an IBM Personal Computer XT or an IBM Personal Computer Expansion Unit omit the following information and continue with Tool Requirements.

- The Cluster Adapter requires your IBM Personal Computer System Unit to have a BIOS ROM module dated 10/27/82 or later. To determine the date of your ROM module, run the following BASIC program. Type the program exactly as shown.

20 FOR X=&HFFF5 TO &HFFFF

```


The date that is displayed is the date of your ROM module. Contact your authorized IBM Personal Computer dealer for a ROM module if it is needed.

Refer to the *IBM BASIC* manual for additional information on BASIC programs.

- The Cluster Adapter may be installed in either the system unit or the expansion unit.

- Medium-size, flat-blade screwdriver.

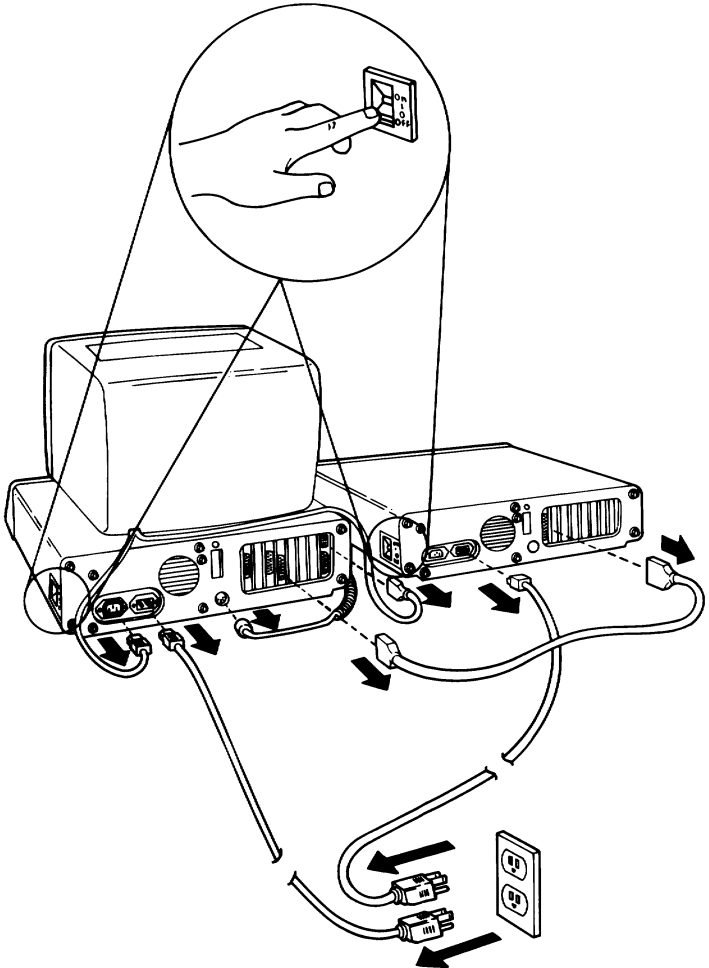

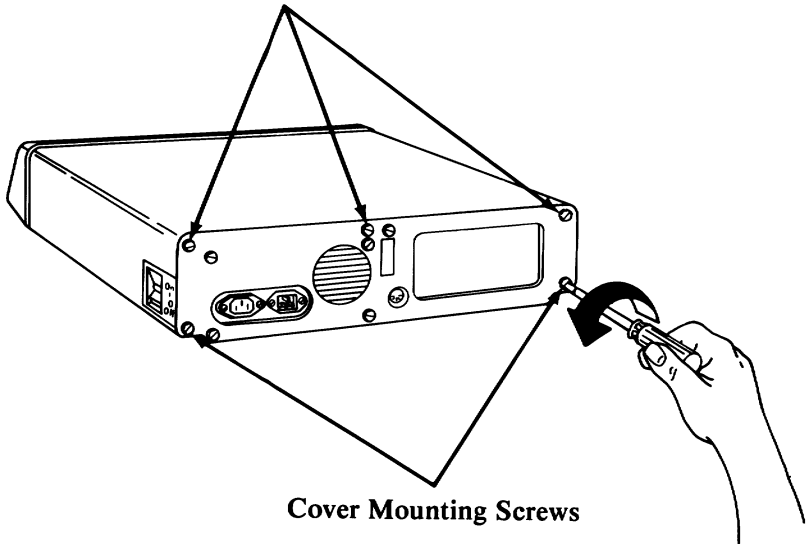
Installation Instructions

- 1** Set the Power switch on the system unit (and expansion unit, if attached) to Off.
- 2** Set the Power switches on all external devices (printer, TV, etc.) to Off.
- 3** Unplug the system unit's (and expansion unit's) power cord from the wall outlet.
- 4** Disconnect all cables from the rear of the unit in which the option is to be installed.

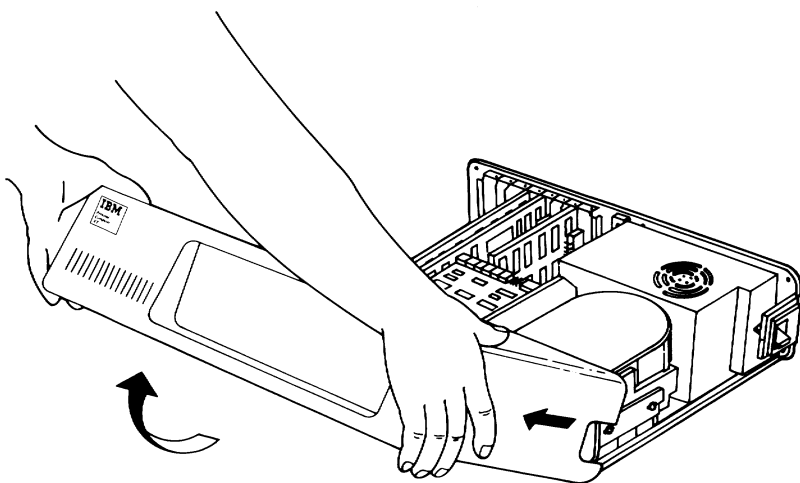
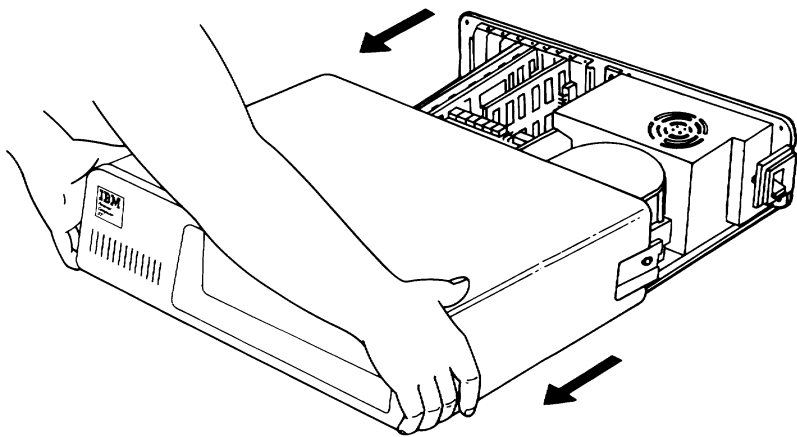


- 5** Move your keyboard and all disconnected devices away from the work area.
- 6** Move the unit in which you are installing the adapter (system unit or expansion unit) to allow access to the rear.
- 7** Use a flat-blade screwdriver or 1/4-inch nutdriver and remove the cover mounting screws by turning them counterclockwise as shown below. Save the screws for the reinstallation of the cover.

(These screws may not be present on your unit)

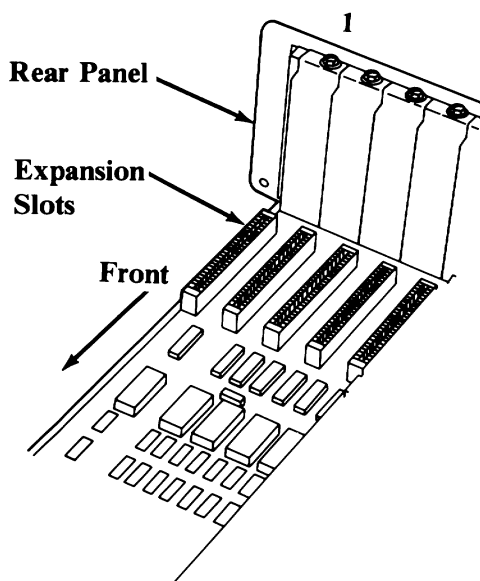


- 8** Carefully slide the unit's cover away from the rear and to the front, as shown in the figure below. When the cover will go no further, tilt it up, remove it from the base, and set it aside.

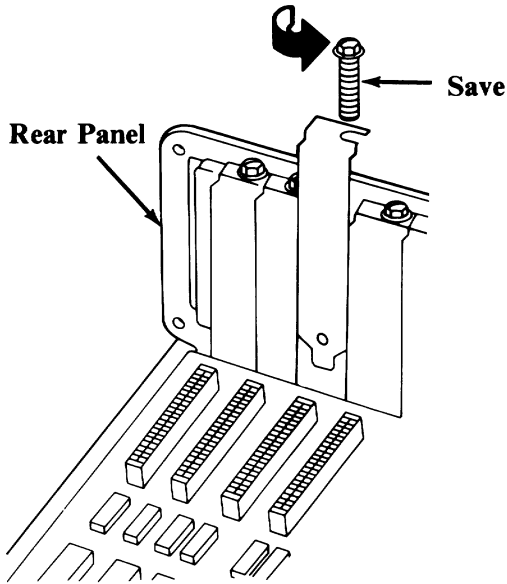

With the front of the unit toward you, look at the expansion slots inside the unit. The expansion slots are numbered from the left beginning with slot 1. If your unit has only 5 expansion slots, you can install the option in any unused slot. If your unit has 8 expansion slots, you can install the option in any unused slot from 1 through 6.



- 10** Use a flat-blade screwdriver or 3/16-inch nutdriver and remove the screw that holds the expansion-slot cover in place by turning the screw counterclockwise. Save the screw for installation of the option.

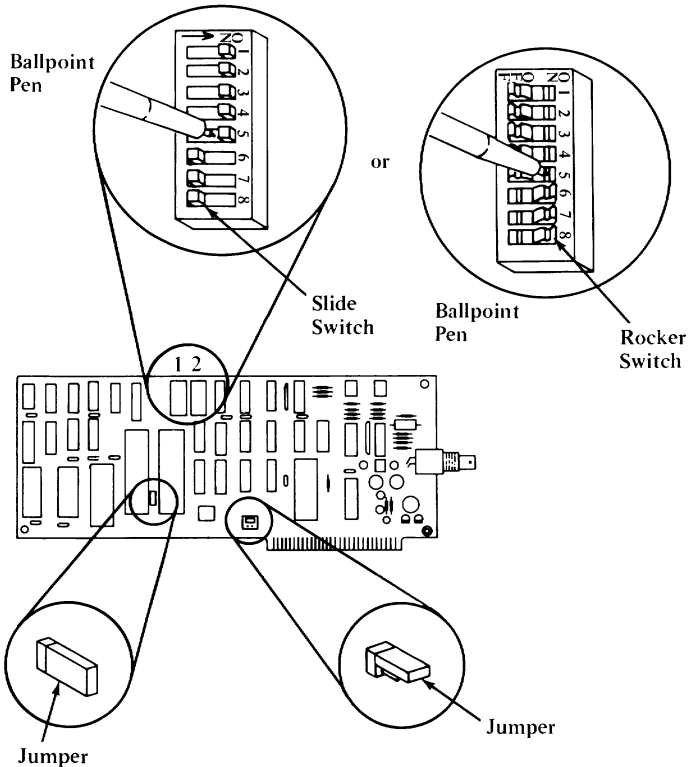


11 Look at the figure below and familiarize yourself with the Cluster Adapter, the location of the two switch blocks, and the location of the two jumpers.

The two switch blocks set the adapter number, the station address, and remote initial program load (IPL is a request for an operating program from another station on the Cluster). Special software is required for this function.

The two jumpers must be installed as shown.

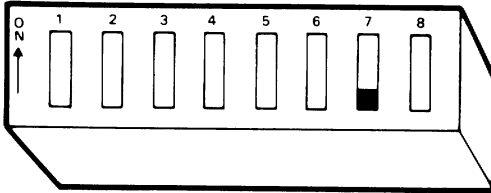
Set the switches as described under "Cluster Adapter Switch Settings."



NOTE: Set a rocker switch by pressing the rocker down to the desired position.

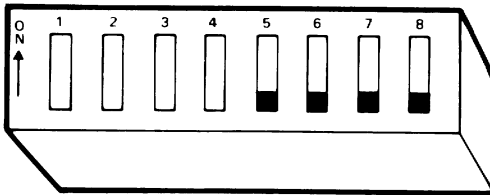
Cluster Adapter Switch Settings

The two switch blocks on the Cluster Adapter are eight-position switches. The settings of the switch positions on the following pages determine the adapter number, the station address, and remote IPL (On/Off).



Switch Block 1

7	Reserved (Always Off)
8	Remote IPL (On/Off)






Switches 5 through 8 of Switch Block 2 are always set to Off.

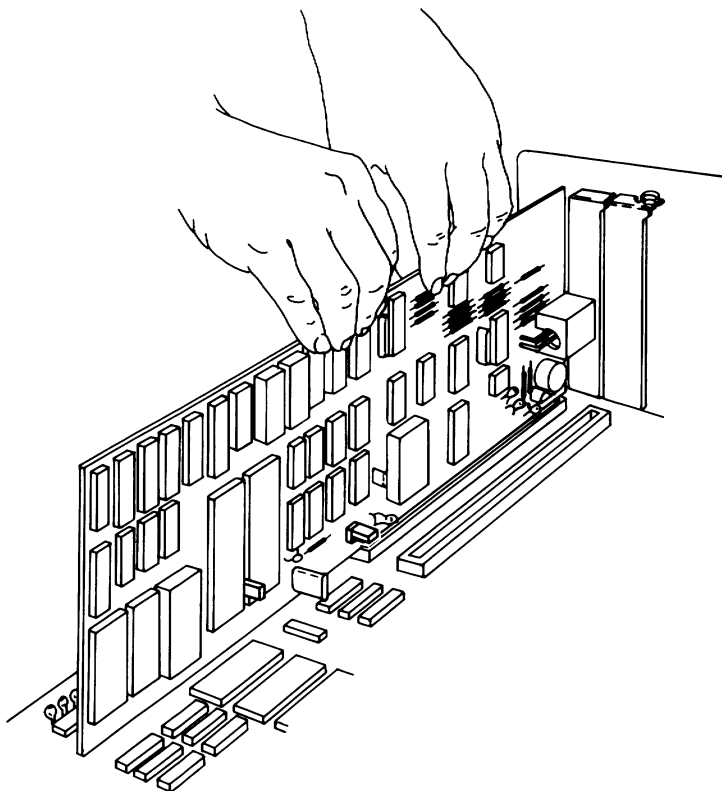
The following figure shows the setting for switch 8 of Switch Block 1.

With switch 8 of Switch Block 1 set to On, the Personal Computer will request an IPL from another station on the Cluster. This request delays POST completion by 30 seconds.

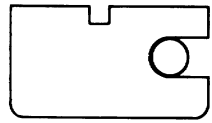
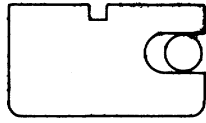
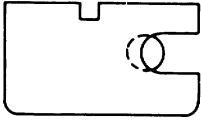

Fill in the necessary information for the adapter number, station address, and remote IPL in step 4 of the "Test 2200" section.

- 12** Hold the option by the top and firmly press it into the expansion slot, as shown below.

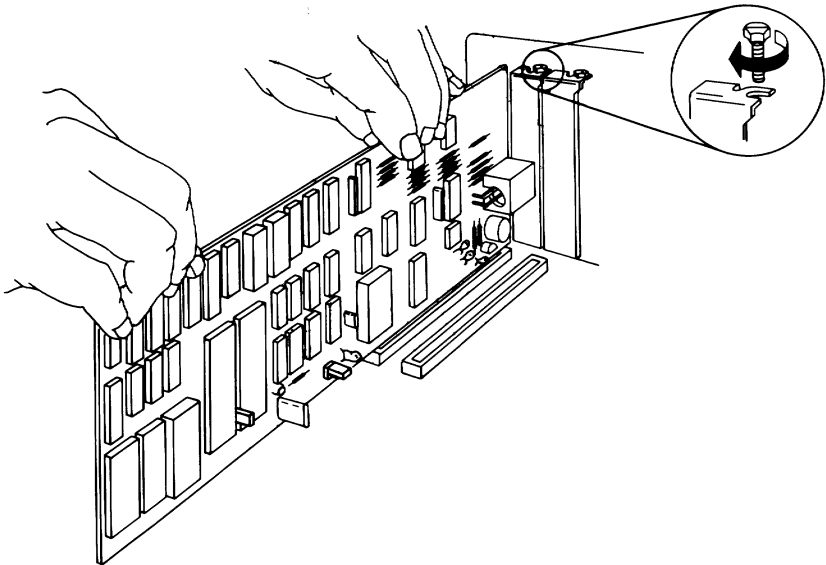


- 13** Align the slot in the option retaining bracket with the hole in the rear panel of the system unit (or expansion unit). Start the screw clockwise, then tighten with a flat-blade screwdriver or a 3/16-inch nutdriver.



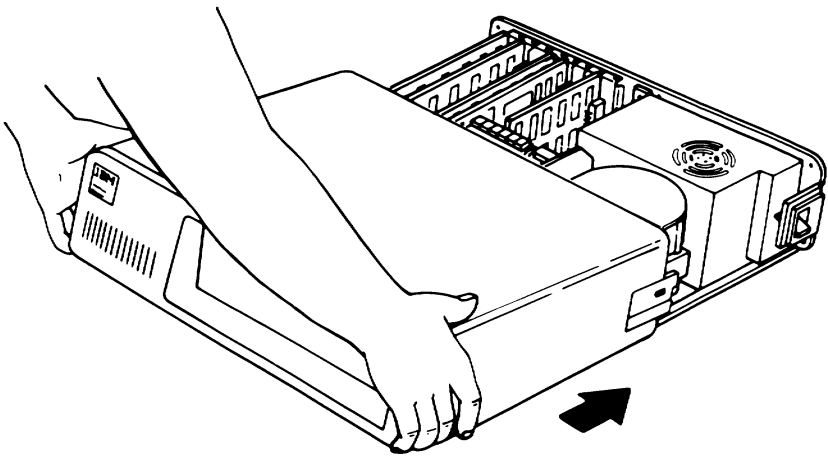
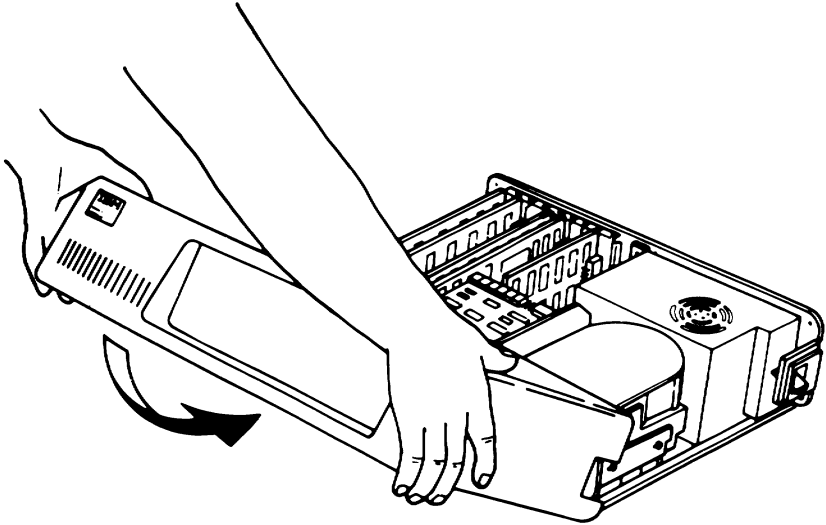

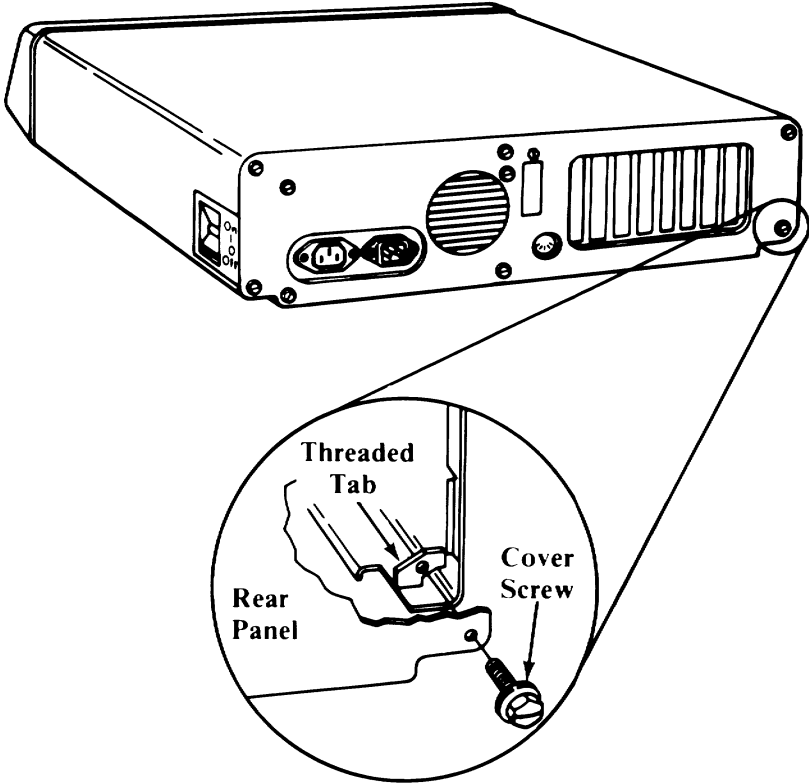


- 14** If you have any other options to install, do so now before putting the unit's cover back on.

Put the unit's cover on by placing it as shown and carefully sliding it toward the rear of the unit.



- 15** When the cover is all the way to the rear, align the screws with the threaded tabs and tighten. Use a flat-blade screwdriver or 1/4-inch nutdriver and turn clockwise.



- 16** When you have completed installation of the Cluster Adapter, contact your Installation Manager for installation of the coaxial cable.
- 17** Your system unit (and expansion unit, if attached) are now ready to be recabled. Refer to the section titled "Setup" or "Introduction/Installation" in your *Guide to Operations* manual.
- 18** If you have any problem after installation, one of the following is the most likely cause:
- Switches set incorrectly
 - A missing jumper on the adapter
 - Cabling is incorrect
 - Other options may have loosened
 - Cluster Adapter is defective

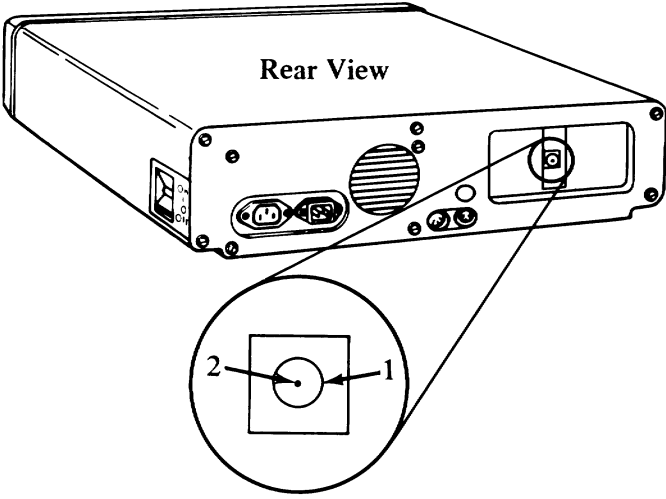

Cluster Information

The following is a sample Cluster and the parts required to install the Cluster cable. All parts shown are available in the IBM Personal Computer Cluster Cable Kit (IBM Option 1501207).

One terminating plug (IBM part number 6320352) must be installed at each end of the main coaxial bus and only two terminating plugs can be on the coaxial cable.

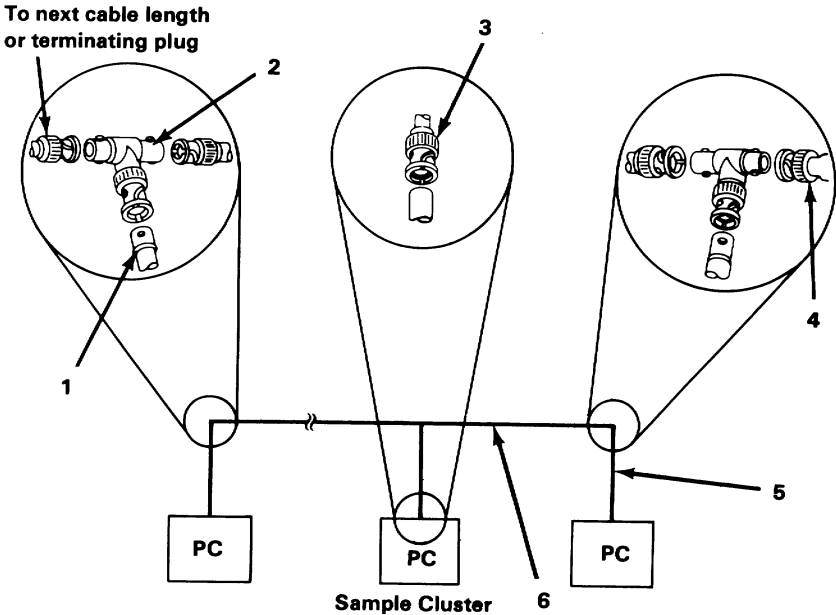
