

## VCR USE W/jr

How To Use A VCR With Your Computer -- Have you ever wondered what those mysterious jacks on the rear of your PCjr labeled "V" and "A" are for? The "Guide to Operations" calls them composite Video and Audio outputs, but what good are they to you when you have a color display or television connected to your computer? Well, those of you who have used, or own a VCR may have noticed that this too has jacks labeled "Video" and "Audio" input. They also have input jacks.. These can be used to link your junior to your VCR via cables equipped with RCA or phone plugs. After connecting the computer to the VCR, set the VCR to "Record" and be sure you have inserted a tape. The images shown on the jr monitor will be saved on the (VCR) tape. What's the real use of this? You can use the setup to save pictures or text created with such programs as PCjr Color Paint or PC Paintbrush. You can even save a game as it is being played and then replay it for analysis. Later you can use it for a Video slide collection, or to add titles to a video tape. Don't be worried if the colors on your monitor look a little different when replayed on the VCR.
